children should have 2 hours' worth of homework every single day! Just before I jumped up to remind him that 25th the literature does not support homework in Primary school aged children, he clarified that kids should rest or sleep for two hours every afternoon!! That they are exhausted from the rigorous learning they do every day. He put forward the importance of play to learning (preaching to the converted here!!) and how studies 3rd have shown the link between a decline in play, an increase in screen time, and the rise in depression and other mental health issues in children and young people. So, if you ever call in to our school, and you think the students are playing, they are! And through play, they are learning language, negotiation, social, physical and mental health skills, which all produce happier, healthier kids who are more able to learn!
