We all had a lovely time in Sydney. It was fabulous, especially watching Tahlia and Chais' faces as they tried new experiences and challenges.



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




#### ATHLETICS CARNIVAL

The Friday after the Sydney excursion, exhausted and sore, we participated in the annual Cowra Small Schools Athletics Carnival. It was glorious day and Tahlia and Chais tried really hard with them both receiving places in a variety of events. Well done!

#### IN THE CLASSROOM



In English, we have continued to work on persuasive text writing. This week, we looked at the importance of looking after all the world's living species. Using the OREO technique, each student wrote a paragraph to support their opinion on this topic. (We also may have eaten some OREOS!) Before, writing this paragraph we spent time reading and learning about the Spotted Handfish. We

used this as the basis to write our OREO paragraph.

Probability and Chance was our focus in Mathematics. Tahlia and Chais brainstormed the language we associate with chance and probability and discussed the likelihood of certain events happening. We played games of chance and predicted

who was most likely to win based on the data and the possible outcomes. On Tuesday, we explored probability further by looking at it as a fraction with 0 being impossible and 1 being certain. Using counters, we then predicted the probability of each colour being pulled out of the container. We discovered that if you predict too early, your guess was often way off the actual answer.

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In Creative Arts this term we have been learning all there is to know about music. The students have been


experimenting with different instruments like the keyboard and with online digital instruments. The students were asked to create their own music using a range of instruments and had lots of fun doing this.


